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Dr. Ondrej Slama is the head of the Clinic of Supportive and Palliative Oncology in Masaryk Memorial Cancer Institute (MMCI), Brno, Czech Republic. He is the Vice Head for education at the Department of Comprehensive Cancer Care at MMCI, the teaching affiliate of the Medical School of Masaryk University Brno. He lectures about different aspects of

supportive and palliative care (e.g. pain and symptom management, ethical issues) on the pregraduate (Brno Medical School) and postgraduate level (Institute for Postgraduate Medical Training in Prague). He is the member of the Board of Certification in Palliative Medicine and Pain Management. He is the Scientific Secretary of the Czech Society for Palliative Medicine (CSPM) and is the liaison person of CSPM with the European Association for Palliative Care.

He has published and spoken widely on the national level on the subjects of pain and symptom control, legal and ethical issues in the end of life care and the organization of palliative care. He is the member of the editorial board of the czecho-slovak journal "Paliativna medicina a liečba bolesti" (Palliative medicine and pain management).

Dr Slama received his Medical degree at the Masaryk University Medical School Brno, Czech Republic in 1994. He consequently pursued residency training and passed the specialization degree in Internal Medicine (1998), followed by specialty training and certification in Medical Oncology (2000) and subspecialty training and certification in Palliative Medicine and Pain Management (2005). He earned his Ph.D. in Public Health (2009). His research issue was the clinical, ethical and legal aspects of decision making about CPR in terminal cancer patients.
